Abstracts should not exceed 250 words and must be single spaced. Use 12 pt Times Roman font. Do not use bold fonts. Titles should be in UPPER CASE.

Ensure you include an email address for the author who intends to make the presentation, and place an asterisk (*) after the name.

Indicate whether the presentation will be oral (O) or poster (P) and (CCFFR) or (SCL) or (SWS) after the title. If you are willing to present in either format, use (O or P).

Please indicate on a separate line after the end of your abstract to which theme (1-10) your presentation is most closely related and whether you are a graduate student (GS; not noted on programme).

If your presentation does not fit any of the session themes, please type "11-contributed paper".
